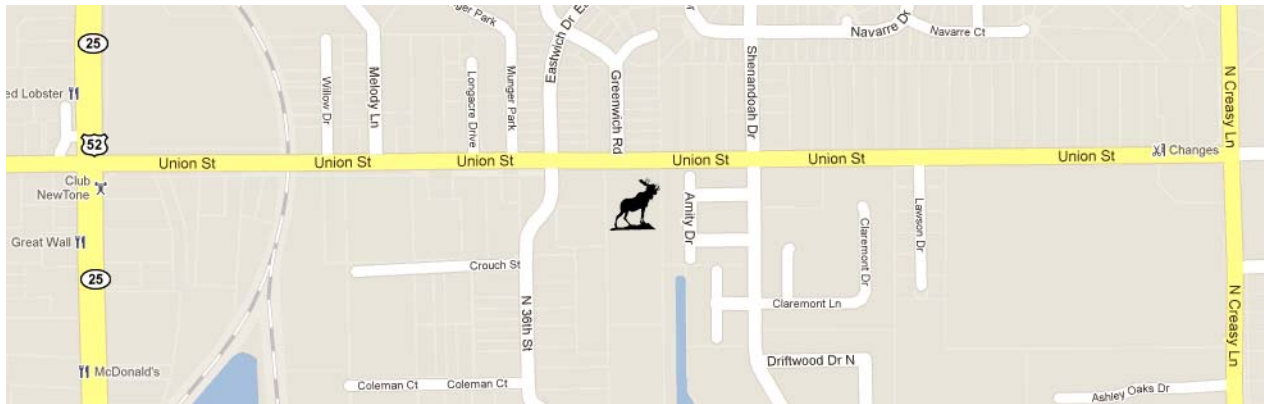

Visiting Troop 310

On **Tuesday, September 13th**, at **7:00 PM** we will be **visiting with Troop 310** at the Moose Lodge at 3601 Union St in Lafayette (see map below). Park in the back - if the weather is nice, we will meet in the gazebo instead of inside. Our boys will see how the Troop works, and work with the Boy Scouts on planning our outdoor activity with Troop 310 – visiting them at the Feast of the Hunter's Moon! Parents are welcome to stay at this meeting and learn about how Boy Scouting differs from Cub Scouting.



We are also invited to join **Troop 310** for the day at the **Feast of the Hunter's Moon** on **Saturday, September 24th**, and to have dinner with them at the Feast grounds. Unfortunately, they were not able to get camping space for us – space is tight this year. We will work out the details at the meeting on the 13th.

About Troop 310

Troop 310 meets every Tuesday during the school year, except for the first Tuesday of the month, which is an officers' meeting. They have twenty boys on the roster, with about a dozen active at any time, the rest being busy with sports. They go on an outing every month, frequently camping in state parks. Some of their favorites are the December Turkey Run trip, January skiing outing, and their annual video game/dodgeball lockin. Shooting sports are also popular with Troop 310.

Troop 310 is also active in the summer. They are planning a trip to the Boundary Waters for this coming summer, as well as summer camp at Camp Buffalo in June and Camp Ransburg in July. They are also planning an outing to the Gettysburg battlefield for Memorial Day weekend.

Troop 310 has several fundraisers throughout the year. They participate in the annual Council popcorn sale, and also work at the Feast of the Hunter's Moon, delivering firewood to all the campers. Finally, they operate a vendor's booth at Purdue football games. They maintain "scout accounts" with the troop, to help the boys earn and save money for big items, such as scout summer camp and high adventure trips.
