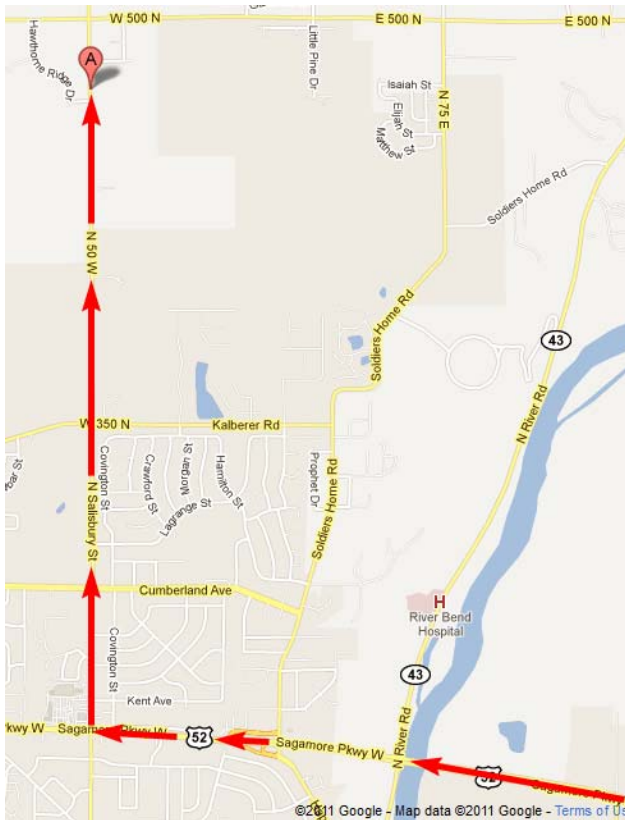

Visiting Troop 335

On Tuesday, September 27th, at 7:00 PM we will be visiting with Troop 335 at St. Andrew United Methodist Church, 4703 N 50 W, West Lafayette, IN, 47906. To get there, come west on US 52 across the river, then turn right on N. Salisbury St. Salisbury will become N 50 W; St. Andrew UMC will be on your right (see map below). Our boys will see how the Troop works, and work with the Boy Scouts on planning our outdoor activity with Troop 335 – camping at Cary and experiencing a Boy Scout Campout. Parents are encouraged to attend the meeting and learn Troop 335 and how they implement the principles of Scouting.



We are also invited to join **Troop 335** on a campout from 10 AM Saturday Oct. 8 through 9 AM Sunday October 9, at Cary Camp. Menus and planning for the campout will occur during the troop visit on the 27th. On the campout our Webelos and the scouts of 335, will set up and take down camp, cook their own meals, and take part in activities run by the scouts.

About Troop 335

Troop 335 meets every Tuesday from 7:15 PM to 8:30 PM at St. Andrew United Methodist Church in West Lafayette. Troop 335 has approximately thirty scouts at each meeting.

Troop 335's outings since the fall of 2010 include skiing; the Klondike Derby; EAA Young Eagles; Indiana Dunes; USAF museum; summer camp at Camp Buffalo, high adventure trips, an adventure race (biking, hiking, swimming, camping); cave campout; Cabin Campout with board games; and an overnighter at Climb Time. 335's 2010 High Adventure trip was canoeing in the Boundary Waters, and in 2011 335 had both a Philmont Trek and an Isle Royale backpacking trip. In 2012 there will be a Philmont Trek and

a Sea Base expedition. Service projects have included picking apples for the Food Pantry, working at the Tippecanoe County Historical Society booth at the Feast, and invasive plant removal. Troop 335 is active in council and district activities, including attending camporees and selling popcorn. 10% of a scout's popcorn sales goes into a troop account to help pay for outings.

Troop 335 prides itself on being "boy run" and of having advancement follow from an emphasis on scouting skills, leadership, and the principles of scouting. In its 85+ years Troop 335 has averaged over one Eagle Scout a year and will soon have its 100th Eagle Scout.
