

Webelos Troop 372 Campout
February 10-12, 2012
Camp Buffalo, north of Monticello

Troop 372 would like to invite the Webelos that will be joining their troop, along with any Webelos that are undecided or are still in need of an outing, to join them on February 10-12 at Camp Buffalo for ILST (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops) training. This course teaches troop organization, vision, servant leadership and teamwork; all of these skills are important in troop operation. We will be staying in cabins but some of the training takes place outside so you will need to bring appropriate clothing for the weather. Note that each Webelos must be accompanied by an adult who has agreed to be responsible for him.

Cost: \$20/person (scout or adult). This covers all 3 meals on Saturday, breakfast Sunday morning, and snacks on Friday and Saturday evenings. If paying by check, make your check payable to "Troop 372", *not* "Pack 3371". ☺

Logistic details:

We will rendezvous at 6:15 PM at the north side of the Home Depot parking lot on Friday, February 10th, and we will leave that location promptly at 6:30 PM. Feel free to arrange carpooling. Maps, directions, and permission slips will be provided at the rendezvous. We will return to the same location at 12 noon on Sunday, February 12th. Please eat dinner before joining us on Friday, as we will have only a light snack that evening.

Registration:

If you want to go, you must sign up by February 1st, so that the Troop knows how much food to get. Registration is easy; just tell Mr. Rattray the name of the attending boy and attending parent or other relative. Payment can be made at the rendezvous. If cost is an issue, speak to Mr. Rattray.

Things to bring

- Hiking /snow boots (more than one pair is recommended)
- Warm clothes for the weekend
- Warm hat; i.e. knit cap
- Winter coat/scarf/gloves
- Rain gear (depending on weather)
- Sleeping bag
- Small Pillow
- Toiletries
- Compass
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Personal First Aid kit
- BSA Medical form, parts A and B, if you haven't submitted one yet.
- Medications – any prescription medications should be sent in the original container, and given to the Scoutmaster, who will give the appropriate doses to the Scout.

Since we will not be backpacking, it is easiest to pack your stuff in totes or duffel bags. The troop has an equipment trailer that will take all of our gear all the way to the cabin. Note that we will have to hike part of that distance, so please make sure your stuff goes in the trailer!
